## Car-train crash kills couple

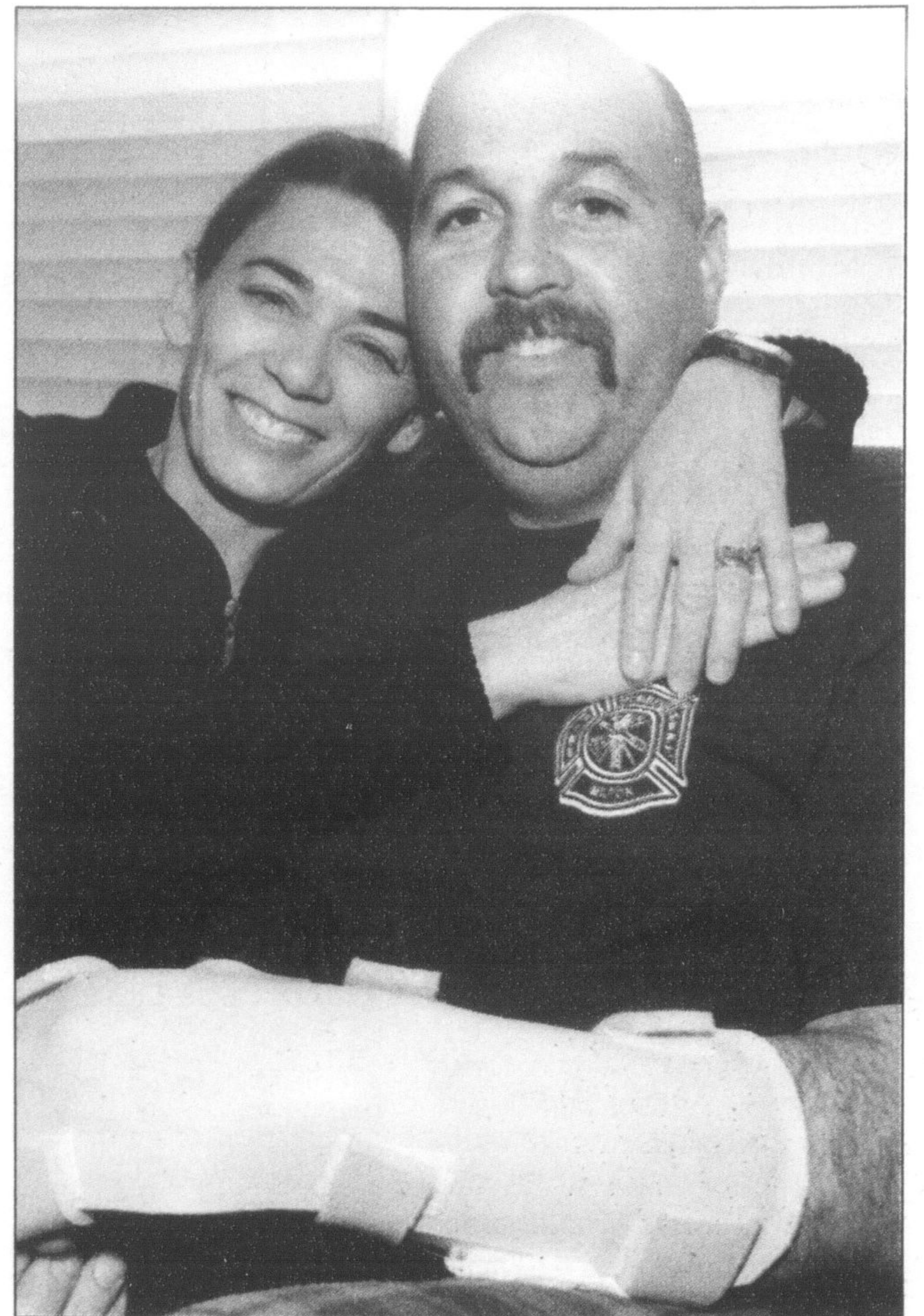
Milton saw one of its worst fatalities in years in July, with a Rockwood couple killed when their car was forced onto the Trafalgar Road tracks — being knocked onto them from behind by another vehicle — and struck by an evening rush-hour GO train. A 28-year-old Milton man was charged with impaired driving causing death.

## Chudleigh wins nail-biter

In by far the closest provincial election in recent memory, long-time Conservative incumbent Ted Chudleigh barely held on to his Halton seat on October 10 — eclipsing Liberal challenger Gary Zemlak by a mere 164 votes. Delivering one of Ontario's narrowest races, Chudleigh and Zemlak exchanged leads several times throughout the night, with the MPP finally declared victorious around 2:30 a.m. Zemlak's close-but-no-cigar showing continued a trend for the Liberals, who've been gaining significant ground on the Tories in Halton over the past decade.

## Two injured in sword attack

A bizarre evening incident led to two men being injured with a samurai sword in early December. One of them, off-duty firefighter Steve Reynolds, was hailed as a hero for apprehending a distraught woman, wielding the weapon at the Steeles Avenue and Martin Street Petro Canada service centre. He received a severe laceration across the arm for his efforts. Just minutes earlier the woman had allegedly struck her boyfriend on the shoulder, arm and side of the head with the sword in a Steeles Avenue apartment. A 21-year-old Milton woman faces a series of assault-related charges.
