

Fire at home on Christmas Day

Firefighters and police were called out to a blaze Christmas Day after a candle ignited a pair of drapes.

Police said emergency workers received a call from a house on Wakefield Road at about

11:30 a.m. When they arrived, they found some fabric had caught fire in a bedroom.

The blaze was extinguished thanks to crews from the Milton Fire Department, and a resident who attempted to put out the

fire was treated for smoke inhalation.

Firefighters were called back at 7 p.m. that night after the fire re-ignited.

Damage to the home is estimated at about \$50,000.

Worker suffers head injuries in fall

A Burlington man was taken to hospital Sunday morning after an industrial accident left him with a concussion and gash to his head.


Police said the 60-year-old employee was working at Ryder transportation on Industrial Drive at about 7:30 a.m. when a metal walkway he was standing on gave out.

He fell into the pit below where oil changes are done, and the walkway landed on top of him, police said.

The victim was transported to Milton District Hospital, where he was treated — he required stitches to his head — and released.

The Ministry of Labour is investigating.

Proposed Flamborough Quarry Haul Route Study

St Marys Cement is conducting a Haul Route Study for the proposed Flamborough quarry located on 11th Concession Road East at Milborough Line.
