Store robbed at gunpoint

Police are looking for a lone gunman who robbed the Rabba Fine Foods at Derry and Trudeau roads early Wednesday morning.

Police said the suspect entered the store at about 5 a.m. armed with a long gun. He demanded cash; and the male employee co-operated, handing over an undisclosed amount.

The suspect fled on foot, possibly into an awaiting vehicle, which may have been a dark

He's described as white and five-foot-eight to five-foot-10. His face was covered with a scarf and he was wearing dark pants and boots.

Men beaten and robbed

Two young men were violently robbed on their way home from a local restaurant early Saturday morning.

Police said the two Milton men, aged 22 and 24, left Ned Devine's at Derry Road and Ontario Street at about 2 a.m. and were near the pedestrian walkway between Derry Road and Commercial Street when they were jumped by four males and beaten.

The attackers took a quantity of cash and a BlackBerry before running north toward a Commercial Street townhouse complex.

Police arrived and recovered the Blackberry, but the suspects were nowhere to be found.

Both victims were treated at Milton District Hospital and released. The 24-year-old victim suffered several broken bones to his nose and head area, while the younger man suffered bruises and swelling to his head.

The suspects are described as white males. One of them was described as being between 18 and 22, at least six feet, wearing a tan jacket with fur and a baseball hat.

> Two 13-year-old boys were arrested and released to their parents. No charges will be laid. The teens will enter a youth diversion program.


Cocaine case in court next week
