## Renowned musicians can be found right here

But what some Miltonians don't realize is that beautiful music by renowned musicians can be heard right in their own community, seven times each year.

For more than two decades the volunteers of Milton Concert Presentations (MCP) have been working to make high quality performances accessible.

"We bring musical performances of a professional quality," explained board member Heather Shoemaker.

The organization presents concerts in a variety of styles, including classical, jazz, opera and Broadway.

"We bring in some spectacular performers," Shoemaker said, adding the Czech Philharmonic Orchestra recently made its Canadian debut in Milton.

The concerts — which can draw as many as 500 people — take place at St. Paul's United Church, 123 Main St. E.

"The nice thing about St. Paul's is

> On April 4 and 25, MCP will bring to town the Hamilton Philharmonic Orchestra and a trio of soloists performing "Broadway to Opera" respectively.

Tickets cost \$35 each for adults, \$30 for seniors and \$25 for students.
