Education and empowerment of youth are priorities that've dominated Trudeau's professional and personal life. He has been actively involved in Katimavik, Canada's leading national youth and volunteer service program.

He has also been involved with the Canadian Avalanche Foundation and wilderness groups such as the Nature Conservancy of Canada and the Canadian Parks and Wilderness Society.

The Region presents the chair's breakfast and the scholarship programs in conjunction with the Chair's Roundtable

on the Environment, a working group composed of individuals from the corporate and community sectors. The group provides direction to the Region for both the awards and the breakfast and reviews all applications to determine award and scholarship recipients.
