had to wait more than 30 seconds to do so. A 24-hour speed study was also done and showed that most vehicles travelling the downtown stretch were going 46 km/h in a 50 km/h zone.

A number of options to improve pedestrian safety in the area were then reviewed, such as reducing the speed limit to 40 km/h, designating the section as a Community Safety Zone, installing additional signage or even prohibiting vehicular traffic on Main Street between Martin and James streets to create a pedestrian mall - something staff is recommending be considered in the future.

It was determined that more signs would be the best move, as 40 km/h

zones are reserved for school frontages and warrants haven't been fulfilled for a Community Safety Zone.

Wards 2 and 4 Councillor Colin Best urged staff to put the signs up as soon as possible. "Traffic is totally confused about who's going first."

Scherer said while his first preferred option was to designate the area a Community Safety Zone, he thinks signage is a good idea.

The motion will go before town council at its meeting Monday, Feb. 25.

A report on truck traffic in the downtown is expected to be on committee and council's agenda next month.
