Eco Chic

Colours are gentle and forgiving, the purest white, the palest lemon, the most brilliant chartreuse. Materials are close to nature - raw wood in all its glory, stone, mother of pearl, hand crafted textiles. Colours and materials unite in patterns that replicate botanical forms, artwork recreates the natural world. In window fashions look for fabrics created from grasses, reeds and bamboo. I think of a simple roller shade that filters light through homespun yarns.

Another change is that people now stay home for many of the experiences they used to go out for. Movie night happens in home theatres. Big screens, access to media over satellite and internet connections, means that home is more important than ever. This importance is expressed in Classic Creations, a look that has always been in style, a look built around the idea of heirloom furniture, and lush fabrics.

Colours are nostalgic - burgundy, plum, jade,



gold and spice. The star fabrics are Dupioni silks, and in the windows are Roman shades, in the traditional luxurious style. Levolor has introduced a wide range of exclusive fabrics, not just for Romans but also for roller shades.
