


Many of you must be wondering when you will see changes at the site. The answer is a somewhat unspecific 'soon-ish'. What does that mean? Well, the Town of Milton has applied for grant funding for Beaty Branch through the Municipal Infrastructure Investment Initiative, and as a result, must await notification about the success of the grant before putting a shovel in the ground. Notification will be provided no later than March 31, 2008. You can be sure that everything will be ready to go once this important news is heard.

It has been a wonderful old fashioned winter: for someone like me, who grew up in Victoria, B.C. [a place with few snow expectations] this is the Ontario winter that I've expected but rarely experienced since moving here in 1984. 
