A bartender testified Thursday that she saw Dylan Palmer with two people at Charley Fitzwhiskey's shortly before a collision that killed a man, seriously injured a woman and saw Palmer charged with drunk driving.

Barbara McCannel told Judge Stephen Brown on the fifth day of Palmer's trial in Oakville that she saw Palmer with two friends at the Ontario Street bar "toward the end of the night" and that they left sometime between 2 and 2:30 a.m. February 23, 2007.

Court heard McCannel recognized Palmer because he came to the bar somewhat frequently but didn't know who the other two people — a woman and a man — were. She said the man "seemed drunk" and was yelling in the

At 3 a.m., Palmer, his girlfriend Lori McKinley and friend Jason Wood — all from Milton — were involved in a crash at Fifth Line and Steeles Avenue when their car hit the back of a tractor-trailer.

died instantly, while McKinley suffered serious injuries.

Palmer, 32, was charged with impaired and dangerous driving causing death and bodily harm, as well as driving with over the legal limit of alco-

He pleaded not guilty.

McCannel didn't have much information about the activities of the trio that night, because she was serving customers on the floor, not at the bar, she told the court. She couldn't say if they

had been drinking or how much.
