

Some things, like olives and brussels sprouts, are acquired tastes.

I think maybe it's the same with classical music. The more you listen to it and train yourself to think about such things as pitch, timbre and tone, the more appealing — and no doubt layered and complex — it becomes.

But on the surface, it can be a bit dull.

That's what I found myself thinking after I attended the Milton Choristers' recent performance of 'Classics of the Romantic Era.'

The Milton Choristers are no doubt a group of talented singers doing what they love, which was well demonstrated at their performance last Saturday night at Grace Anglican Church.

But I wasn't wowed.

Directed by Sonja van de Hoef and accompanied on the organ by Norman Reintamm, the Choristers performed two pieces to a packed house — Gabriel Fauré's Requiem and Franz Schubert's Mass in G.


me get more out of the concert than I would have on my own - introductory explanations of each piece by van de Hoef, and the musical insight of Laura Jeffrey, director of The Women of Note, who sat beside me.

When the group began to sing the first piece, I expected to be blown away by the beauty of their blending voices, ringing against the walls of the church. Instead, I found it rather lacklustre.

I thought it might simply be the fact it was a mass for the dead, not exactly known for its resounding joy. But Jeffrey confirmed what my ears suspected, that the group was "pitchy," as Randy from American Idol would say, and just not quite there.
