new attitude has been adoptsince the recent arrival of principal, Heather Kempff, and viceprincipal, Mark Lyall.

"Work hard, be nice, make a difference," is an attitude for life, said Kempff.

"This is not just an attitude for school but for life in general," she said. "In my experience, I have found that if something is going wrong, it's because of one of two things: either someone is not working hard or they're not being nice. things happening here that you wouldn't normally see in a more urban setting. For example, we had a horse visit for 'Bring a Pet to School Day,' which was ed at Brookville Public School really unique," laughed Kempff.

Lyall, a Nassagaweya resident for 26 years, was previously the vice-principal at George Kennedy Public School in Georgetown. Having had four of his children graduate from Brookville, he's very familiar with the close-knit community. He said that, with both the principal and vice-principal being new, the situation is more of an opportunity than a challenge.

"This is actually a fresh start and wonderful opportunity for both Heather and I and the school as a whole. We all share the same views and beliefs in education and that is always a great thing. The transition for us both has been very easy thanks to such a wonderful bunch of students, excellent staff and supportive parents," said Lyall.


"There are so many sports, activities and things going on here and everyone is very eager and excited with all that is happening at Brookville right now. It's a very positive atmosphere."
