



A 56-year-old Waterdown man has been charged with impaired driving, driving with over the legal limit of alcohol in his blood and breach of probation.

Equipment stolen

Meeting important for seniors: MCPC

Police constable to discuss power of attorney

There's a lot misconceptions out there about the authority of the power of attorney document.

With that in mind, the Milton Community Policing Committee will hold an information meeting on the subject Tuesday night at the Milton police station on Childs Drive.

Constable Jackie Brennan, co-ordinator of Halton Regional Police's Elder Services, will speak about the increased importance of understanding power of attorney documents and how not to be taken advantage of. Specific topics of discussion will include what it means to be competent and how people lose their decision-making ability.

Running from 7 to 8:30 p.m., the meeting is open to the community at large, not just seniors.

Hit-and-run suspect in court

The case of a man charged in the hit-and-run death of a Milton teen is scheduled to return to court next month.

Stephen Alchin, 34, of Halton Hills, is scheduled to appear at Superior Court of Justice in Milton May 5.


Alchin has been charged with dangerous driving causing death and failing to stop at the scene of an accident following the death of Lauren Cooper, 18. Cooper was rollerblading the night of July 13, 2006 on Second Line, just north of No. 15 Sideroad, when she was struck and killed by a vehicle.

Fraud case back in court Mon.

The case of a Milton businessman facing a handful of fraud charges will return to court next week.

Nick Cortese, 43, will next appear at the Ontario Court of Justice in Milton Monday, a date that was set at a recent appearance.

Cortese has been charged with seven counts of fraud over \$5,000 in connection with a series of alleged fraudulent loans and mortgages totaling more than \$8 million.
