Time has come to finally 'relax' for retiring fairground custodians

Couple turn over responsibilities after nearly half a century

They've been surprised by wildlife, lovingly chased by dogs and they've handled emergencies during events, but now, after more than 48 years, it's time for Bruce and Annie Bird to retire from their positions as custodians of the Milton Fair Grounds.

"We have worked year-round, almost seven days a week for so many years, and now it will be nice to have some time to relax and visit with friends when we feel like it," said Annie. "My son told me he's been waiting for us to retire for years now."

Bruce, 82, and Annie, 78, accepted the job in 1959 "to help someone out." Bruce was doing shift work at P.L. Robertson and Annie took care of their home and family, and then they worked at the fairgrounds afterward.

Neither believed that that they would have stuck with it for so long, said Annie. But the custodial job "kept them healthy."

"We were always on the move there for several hours each day, mowing lawns, cleaning the buildings, some heavy lifting, whatever needed to be done. It kept us healthy and active and we enjoyed every bit of it," she said.

Being custodians, Annie and Bruce mowed and trimmed the lawns and cleaned the eight buildings on the 23-acre property every day. During the auctions, the couple also ran the lunch counter. Most days, they worked for several hours, moving at their own pace and enjoying the time together. Some days though, said Annie, they would be at the fairgrounds all day if there was a big event happening.

Annie said the fairgrounds have become a lot busier in the past five or six years with a number of bigger functions scheduled including dog shows, picnics, and the Strawberry Fair, all which made their job a bit more demanding.

"With the bigger events, we spent more time on the grounds, made sure the washrooms were kept clean, and continuously maintained the buildings. If we hadn't, I guess it would have been a lot messier to clean up at the end," she said.

The Birds, married for nearly 62 years, have five children, 12 grandchildren, and 10 great-grandchildren, most who have helped them at one time or another at the fairgrounds, said Annie.

"One of the best things about being there was we were basically our own bosses," she said. "We could work in the
