

That concludes a solid season for the youngster, who highlighted his provincial qualifying campaign with all-around silver at meet two in Windsor.

Both the St. Peter's boys and Holy Rosary girls were denied a regional medal by Sacred Heart of Burlington, each beaten by eight points.

Able to avert the disastrous start they suffered in semifinal play two days earlier, St. Peter's jumped out to an 8-0 lead and showed a fair amount of intensity the entire way in its 43-35 defeat.

But in the end the Panthers just couldn't neutralize Sacred Heart's hard-charging point guard, who was highly effective at driving to the net and producing in close.

Closing out a rock-solid playoff run, co-captains Mikey Borlongan and Josh Berza each hit double digits with 14 and 10 points respectively.

Daymon Oliveros delivered some impressive defence, while rounding out the starting five were Luke Brandreth and Connor Prince, who helped St. Peter's reach Halton's final four for the first time in nearly a decade.

Adding a regional medal to their haul just wasn't in the cards for Holy Rosary either.

The four-time north Halton champs were consistent throughout the eventual 32-24 loss to Sacred Heart, recording six points in each quarter.

With co-captain and offensive cornerstone Rose Serafini still hobbled by a leg injury sustained in quarterfinal play, Marie Maranan stepped up and led the Hawks with a dozen points.

Soldiering on, Serafini chipped in four points and aided a credible defensive campaign, while four other players reached the score-sheet, including two-way standout Katie


This marked the third straight provincial triumph for


