Man charged in road rage incident in downtown lot

A 22-year-old Toronto man faces charges in connection with an incident of road rage earlier this month.

On April 11, police report a Milton man attempted to pull into the plaza parking lot at Ontario and Main streets around 10 a.m. when his progress was halted by a Ford Explorer blocking the entrance.

The Milton man honked at the Explorer, which promptly led to both drivers exiting their vehicles and getting into a verbal altercation. Both men would eventually get back into their vehicles, only to drive further into the parking lot where they would continue their argument.

As the pair exchanged heated words, a male passenger of the Explorer got out, walked up to the other vehicle's driver and struck him several times with a metal bar, after which the Explorer's driver and passenger fled.

The victim was treated for non-life threatening injuries.

Arrested April 17, the suspect is charged with one count each of assault and assault causing bodily harm.


