Street name changes approved by council (names subject to potential further refinement):

Campbellville Road from Dublin Line to Regional Road 25 — to become No. 5 Sideroad

First Line between Derry and Britannia roads — to become Bronte Street South

Steeles Avenue from Milborough Line to east of Guelph Line — to become

Conservation Road

Campbell Avenue West from Kingsbury Circle to Campbellville Road — to become Campbellville Road

Campbell Avenue, west of Ontario Street South — to become Donald Campbell Avenue

James Snow Parkway, north of Main Street East — to become James Snow Parkway North

James Snow Parkway, south of Main Street East — to become James Snow Parkway South

Nassagaweya Puslinch Townline from No. 10 Sideroad to Little Road — to become Darkwood Road

Nassagaweya Puslinch Townline, north of No. 17 Sideroad — to become Midway Court

No. 3 Sideroad from Nassagaweya Puslinch Townline to First Line Nassagaweya — to become Arkell Road

Walkers Line from Campbell Avenue East to south of No. 3 Sideroad — to become Canyon Road

Fourth Line from north of Derry Road to the CPR tracks — to become Cochrane Road

**Future street name changes, as development requires:**

Lower Base Line East between Sixth Line and Trafalgar Road — to become Lower Base

Line West

Lower Base Line West, east of Fourth Line — to become Longrill Lane

Lower Base Line West between Fifth and Sixth lines — name not determined yet

Main Street West between the new street alignment and Tremaine Road — to become Given Lane

Main Street West between Tremaine Road and Bronte Street — name not determined yet

Regional Road 25 between Derry Road West and Britannia Road West — to become Ontario Street South

No. 3 Sideroad between Tremaine Road and the new alignment of Tremaine Road — to become Kelso Road

### NOTICE TO PROPERTY OWNERS DESTROY NOXIOUS WEEDS

The purpose of the *Weed Control Act* R.S.O. 1990, c. W.5. is to reduce the impact of noxious weeds on land used for agricultural or horticultural purposes.

The Weed Control Act, does not apply to noxious weeds or weed seeds on lands that are far enough away from any land used for agricultural purposes, that they do not interfere with that use.

**NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN** to all persons in possession of land, in accordance with The Weed Control Act, that unless weed seeds and noxious weeds growing on their lands within the Town of Milton are destroyed by the date of June 6th, 2008 and throughout the season, the Town of Milton may enter upon the said lands and have the weeds destroyed, charging the costs against the land in taxes as set out in The Weed Control Act.

The co-operation of all property owners is earnestly solicited. Complaints and inquiries may be made by telephone, to the number listed below. Please note that dandelions, burdock and goldenrod are not considered noxious weeds within the Town of Milton under The Weed Control Act; therefore, complaints concerning these weeds or any anonymous complaints cannot be accepted.

For the information of all property owners, the following are designated as noxious weeds in the Town of Milton:
