Needless to say they had an awesome time, and enjoyed their trip very much. After touring the University, the students had the pleasure of witnessing a production of Romeo and Juliet at the Hart House theatre located on campus.

In other news, all you art fans out there, mark your calendars for Monday May 12th all the way through to Friday May 16th, because Gary Allan High school in Burlington is hosting the annual Halton Secondary Regional Art Show, State of the Art. The show commences at 7:00 pm Monday night, and closes at 3:00 pm on the Friday. For Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday, the gallery will be open to 8:00 at night. E.C. is set to display some of the outstanding work done by students in the Arts Departments. You'll be sure to see things like paintings, drawings, and even masks! Last Friday, the Grade 12 graduating students had the opportunity to leave their mark on E.C. during the Leave A Legacy event which was held that day. This day was an opportunity for grade 12 students to give back to their community and school for the awesome last four years. Highlights of the event included a carwash, which managed to raise \$150 without washing any cars, a nostalgic ceiling painting, and the Inside Ride. The Inside Ride was an indoor fundraiser to raise money for kids with cancer. Grade 12 volunteers raised money with their pledge sheets, and took to their stationary bicycles in the Lockerbay for an intense hour of riding. Six members on each of the twelve teams took turns riding for ten minutes each, and in the end, all of their distances were totalled up, and trophies were awarded. The spirit award went to Team Go Get 'Em, a staff team who showed students the meaning of school spirit. Our very own Allison Wallis won the award for top mileage by a female, who managed to ride 3.9 kilometres in ten minutes. The award for top mileage for a male went to Andrew Croll, who biked an awesome 5.25 kilometres. Finally, the award for top mileage overall for a team went to Teamo Supremo, who biked over an amazing twenty kilometres. Just over \$1,000 was raised for children with cancer to be sent to camp by The Inside Ride. Way to go Drury! Drury is all about helping others and Project Africa is one other example. Project Africa is a student led, social justice initiative that is funding to build a school in Kenya, Africa in partnership with Leaders Today. The committee has been selling 50/50 tickets in the Lockerbay for the last month. A honourable mention goes out to grade 12, David Hand, who has single handily bought almost 30 tickets. The goal is to sell 1,000 tickets at \$2 each, which would bring the pot to \$1,000 for the winner. Tickets will be on sale until they reach this goal. Project Africa is one small step towards making what we hope will be a major difference.

The "Clockwork" production has made a huge commitment to Project Africa as the Arts Department continues to be instrumental in the project. The performance of "Clockwork" was nothing short of fantastic! Four weeks ago the cast met for the first time. Director/producer, Mrs. Cates referred to it as a blitz. The cast worked themselves to literal exhaustion in hours of tireless planning and rehearsing. After the bruises, lost voices, and nearly broken bones, the cast and crew pulled off a remarkable performance in a short timeframe. "The combination of a great script and great improvisation made for a hilarious show," said grade 12, Matt Henry. "I saw it all three times." The Arts Department raised an estimated \$1,200 for Project Africa in three showings. A special thanks to all the sponsors, volunteers, the E.C. Drury Food School and everyone who attended for making it possible.

Next on the agenda for the Arts Department is the Bohemian Fair! The Fair will feature the cast of "Come Sail Away", Drury's musical cast and will start at 5:30pm on Wednesday, May 21st. Next week, we will profile the events of the Bohemian Fair in detail.
