

Teen charged after man struck with baseball bat

A Milton teen was arrested and charged with assault with a weapon after an altercation April 30.

Police said two men — who weren't students — were standing in the parking lot of Gary Allan High School at E.C. Drury around 6:30 p.m. when a fight broke out over a woman.

One of the men began to strike the other in the head with a small baseball bat, police said.

The victim, a 24-year-old man, suffered bruising and swelling to a cheekbone.

An 18-year-old Laurier Avenue man has been charged with assault with a weapon, possession of a weapon and uttering a death threat.

Woman faces fraud charges

After a two-month investigation, a local woman has been charged in connection with three separate fraud incidents.

Business cheques were stolen from companies and a home between March 20 and April 27.

Police said that in all three incidents, the cheques were made payable to a suspect who either cashed them — or had someone else do it — or attempted to cash them.

A 41-year-old Milton woman of no fixed address has been charged with theft under \$5,000, five counts of possession of stolen property and five counts of uttering a forged document.

She was held for bail and remains in custody.

Drunk driving charges laid

Police have charged a couple of motorists with drunk driving.

Erratic driving was observed April 26 shortly after 1 a.m. on Derry Road near Holly Avenue, and the driver was arrested.

A 46-year-old Oakville man has been charged with driving with over the legal limit of alcohol in his blood.

And last Friday at 4:30 p.m., a single vehicle collision took place on Trafalgar Road, south of Derry Road, and the driver was arrested.

A 39-year-old Mississauga man has been charged with impaired driving and driving with over the legal limit of alcohol in his blood.

Group charged in break-in

Five young people have been charged in connection with the break-in overnight April 24 of the Boarding Hut store on Main Street.

The arrests were made between April 29 and Wednesday.

Police said the rear window of the store was smashed and about \$5,000 of skateboard merchandise was swiped. Some of the property has since been recovered.

An 18-year old man has been charged with break and enter and possession of stolen property, as has a 16-year-old girl.

A 17-year-old woman has been charged with break and enter and a 20-year-old man has been charged with break and enter, possession of stolen property and obstructing a police officer (He's accused of providing a false name to police when he was arrested).

And a 22-year-old man has been charged with break and enter.

All of the accused are Milton residents, except for the last one, who is from Borden.

The individuals were all released and are scheduled to appear in court.

Trailer stolen

A transport truck trailer was stolen overnight Sunday from a Trafalgar Road truck yard.

Police said the trailer, taken by unknown suspects, was worth \$40,000 and was carrying \$45,000 worth of mowers. The trailer is a white, 53-foot 2007 Stou model with the licence plate D7826F.

Tractor swiped

A tractor unit worth \$60,000 was stolen from a Trafalgar Road truck lot overnight Sunday.

Police said unknown suspects unhooked a white, 2004 Freightliner tractor from its trailer before stealing it. Its licence plate is PZ5855 and it's marked with 'Pentagon Logistics.'

ATV and truck stolen

An ATV and the pick-up truck it was loaded on were stolen from a plaza parking lot Monday evening.

Police said the two vehicles were parked at the plaza at Ontario Street and Derry Road between 7 and 9:15 p.m. while the owner went into a restaurant.

When he returned, the vehicles were gone.

The pick-up is a green, 2002 Ford F-250 with the licence plate 5535TR. It's valued at \$17,000. The ATV is a green, 2004 Yamaha with the licence plate 34NL9. It's worth \$5,000.

Pick-up stolen

A pick-up truck parked in the lot of a local business was stolen in broad daylight last Friday.

Police said the vehicle — a black 2003 Chevrolet Silverado — was parked at GoodLife Fitness on Steeles Avenue when an unknown suspect made off with it. The vehicle, worth \$18,000, has the licence plate 8097MW.

Tools swiped

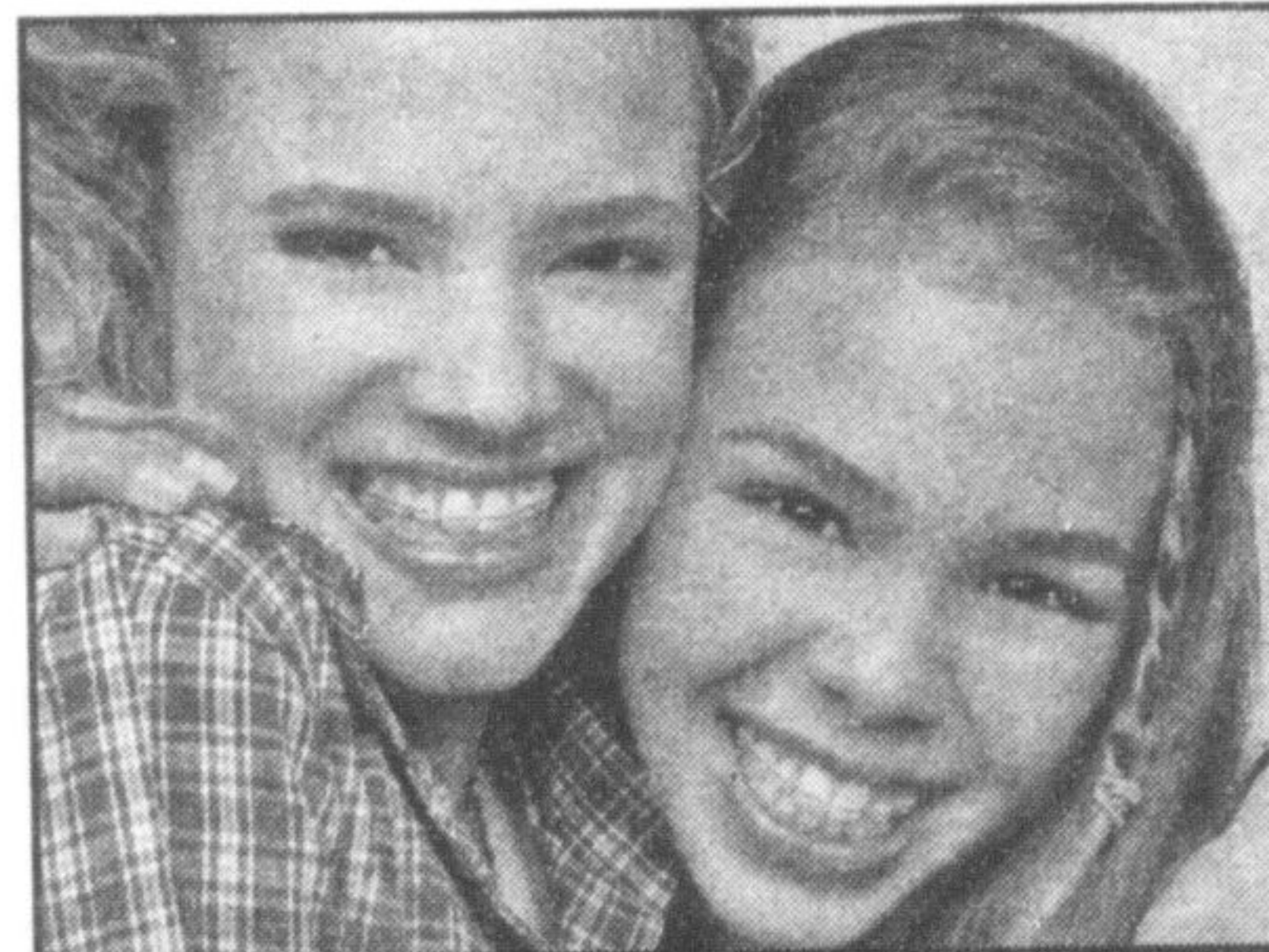
Hand tools valued at \$2,200 were swiped from an Industrial Drive business overnight May 1.
