

Much-improved teen helps MAC to eastern national gold

MacIntyre gives stellar effort in biggest v-ball test to date

The Mountain Athletic Club (MAC) Under-15 boys volleyball team struck gold at the recent Eastern Canadian championships, thanks in no small part to their rural Miltonian.

Despite being among both the team and tournament's youngest competitors — still a couple of months shy of his 14th birthday — Jordan MacIntyre was an intricate part of the title drive in Moncton, New Brunswick.

A left-side hitter who according to coach Chris Marynowicz was the team's most improved player this year, the Brookville School eighth grader helped MAC to a near-perfect run that was punctuated with a 28-26, 25-23 win over the provincial champion Mississauga Pak-men.

MacIntyre's best efforts were reserved for the semifinals, where along with some big kills he delivered crucial blocking and was among the most accurate servers.

His effective, versatile performance fueled a 25-

16, 25-19 decision over Nova Scotia's ESA Castors.

"Jordan was just amazing in that game and I was really surprised and impressed with how he handled the pressure of such a big game," remarked Marynowicz, an assistant coach with Ryerson's men's team.

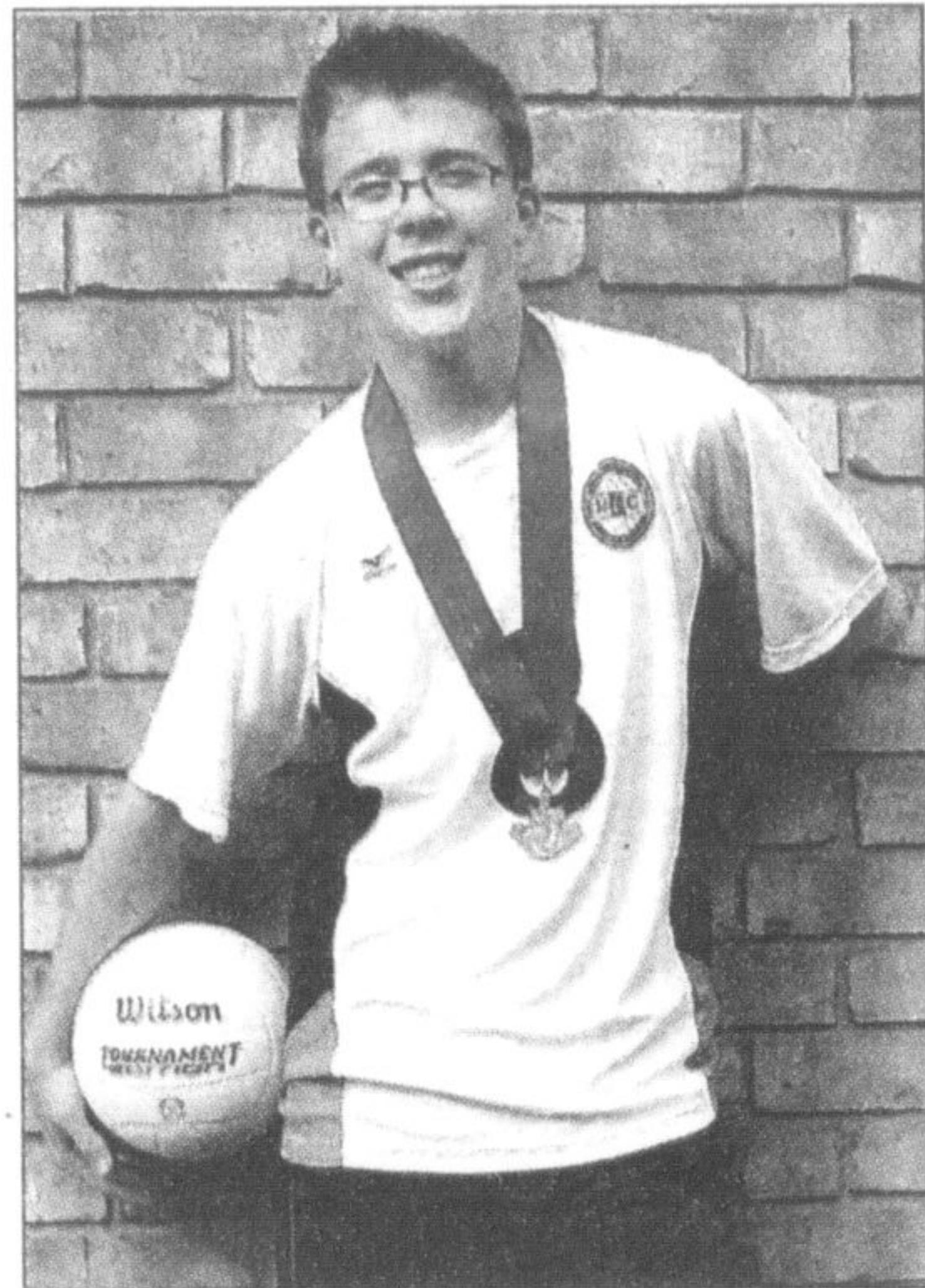
MacIntyre was quick to offer credit back to his coach.

"Coach Chris knows so much about the game. If you can survive the training, you get to play against the best — and win," said the five-foot-eight-inch teen, a well-round honours student at Brookville School whose love for volleyball comes from his three aunts who all played internationally.

Having just prevailed at the eastern nationals, MAC plans to test itself at the other end of the country next year, as well as compete in some international tournaments.

This will no doubt serve to accelerate MacIntyre's already rapid development — as will being part of the program's summer camp.

Noted Marynowicz, "Jordan's got so much potential. He could play university volleyball if he continues to improve his skills at this same rate."

NOTICE OF SURPLUS LANDS

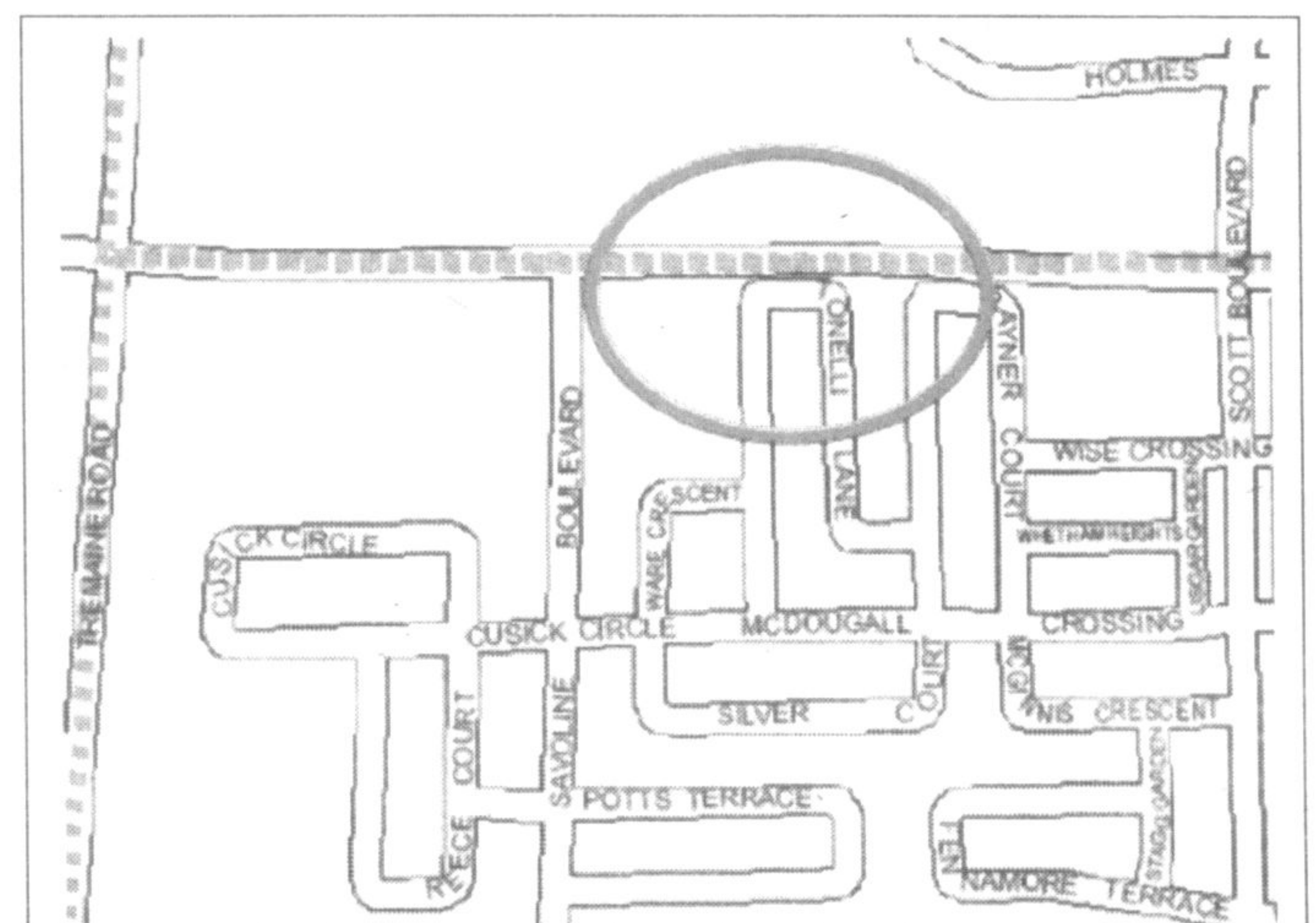
