She went through six cycles of chemotherapy over the nine years, and always focused on how soon she could be back on the bike," she said.

"Mom continued to pursue her other hobbies and interests throughout her battle with cancer. In fact, her indomitable nature and bubbly spirits were an inspiration and comfort to other patients undergoing cancer treatment at Princess Margaret Hospital."

Although Harry still rides, he admitted it was Frances' enthusiasm for cycling that kept him motivated.

Frances didn't like the idea of a conventional gravesite and stone and simply requested a magnolia tree be planted in her memory, which the family did on their properties.

She wanted something that would add enjoyment to a location, thus they chose the bench as the memorial, said Debbrecht.

The bench, made locally, bears Frances' name as well as an inscription, and will be dedicated in a small ceremony this Saturday.

Debbrecht said the bench memorial will contribute to the work of the Destination Campbellville Community Association. Her mother would love the idea of beautifying and boosting Campbellville's agri-tourism and would likely have joined the cause.

"Mom would love to know that there is an ongoing plan to revitalize Campbellville. Being a part of that would be very special to her," said Debbrecht.
