Poice pleads

A suspended Milton police officer pleaded guilty last week to assaulting his wife at the start of a seven-hour standoff at his Cambridge home.

The 39-year-old patrol constable, who had been in jail since his arrest March 1, was released from custody and ordered to live with his father in Mississauga.

He's been ordered not to contact his wife or son.

The 12-year Halton Regional Police veteran still faces other charges related to the standoff including forcible confinement, uttering threats and weapons offences involving handguns, knives and pepper spray.

The officer was also charged with two counts of possessing restricted handguns and ammunition in relation to another incident at his home February 22.

Waterloo Regional Police were called to the officer's home March 1 after his wife called 911.

Police helped the woman and a child out of the house, leaving a distraught man inside, a police spokesperson said shortly after the charges were laid. Nobody was hurt.

The man allegedly barricaded himself inside, and tactical officers surrounded the house, the spokesperson had said.

Thursday, court heard the officer went on stress leave from his job last August, but returned in November.

He was suspended with pay in relation to the February 22 incident a week

He'll return to court in the fall. — With files from The Record

Charges laid in head-on, two-car crash

Drinking and driving charges were laid against a Milton man after a headon collision sent two drivers to hospital last Friday night.

Police said that at about 10:45 p.m., a vehicle was driving northbound on Regional Road 25 near Lower Base Line when it veered into the southbound lane, striking an oncoming vehicle.

Both drivers — the lone occupants in their vehicles — were injured, police said, and a suspect was arrested.

Firefighters from the Milton Fire Department responded, but their services weren't required.

A 45-year-old man of Boston Church Road was charged by Halton Regional Police with impaired driving and driving with over the legal limit of alcohol in his blood.
