## Road rage suspect free on bail



With sobs wracking her body, the sister-inlaw of a man who died early Tuesday in a Hwy. 401 collision made an impassioned plea.

"We want this rage stopped," Gina Mancini told reporters Wednesday outside the Milton courthouse, referring to the alleged road rage that police say led to the accident that killed 55-year-old Miltonian Tony Greco. "Please — it has to stop."

She added the family wants to see justice served.

Moments later, 39-year-old Milton resident Wayne Winsor, charged in connection with Greco's death, was released on \$25,000 bail.

It was much to the disappointment of the dozen-or-so of the victim's family members including Greco's wife, Anna - who attend-

ed the hearing and lined the back of the courtroom.

Winsor has been charged with criminal negligence causing death, dangerous driving causing death and fail to remain causing death.

He turned himself in to the OPP's collision reporting station at Steeles Avenue and Martin Street at 4 p.m. Tuesday, almost 12 hours after the crash, police said.

At the hearing, Winsor — a thin man with short, dark hair - looked noticeably distressed, often leaning his head on the wall behind him, eyes on the ceiling.

Conditions of his release, granted by Justice of the Peace Lena Mills, include that Winsor live with his mother and surety, Jean,

## Town setting growth 'rules' with Region

The Town is laying out ground rules that it wants the Region to follow when it comes to local residential growth beyond 2021.

The proposed list of growth principles prepared by Town staff went before town council at an information workshop held Monday afternoon.

The item comes in response to the Region's Sustainable Halton plan, which is being developed to steer future growth while preserving and protecting things like greenspace and farmland.

As part of the process, Region staff has come up with five concepts that show how about 2,400 hectares of 'greenfields,' or undeveloped land, in Milton and Halton Hills could accom-
