Ball rolling on third phase of growth

The Town is starting the planning process for the third phase of residential development that could bring about 40,000 new citizens to south Milton.

A motion passed by council Monday night effectively gets the ball rolling on the secondary plan for the area known as the Boyne

Survey, which is the land largely framed by Britannia and Tremaine roads and the future Louis St. Laurent Boulevard and James Snow Parkway extensions.

The plan would also encompass the future Milton Education Village lands on Tremaine Road between Derry and Britannia roads.

A secondary plan establishes land uses for a community and provides direction on the type of development that will be permitted.

The Boyne Survey lands cover about 2,500 acres and could house as many people as the other two survey areas in Milton, or an estimated 40,000, said Director of Planning and Development Mel Iovio. He noted that number hasn't been confirmed through any kind of study yet though.

Town Manager of Planning Policy Bill Mann told council that staff anticipates the

ASK EMILY

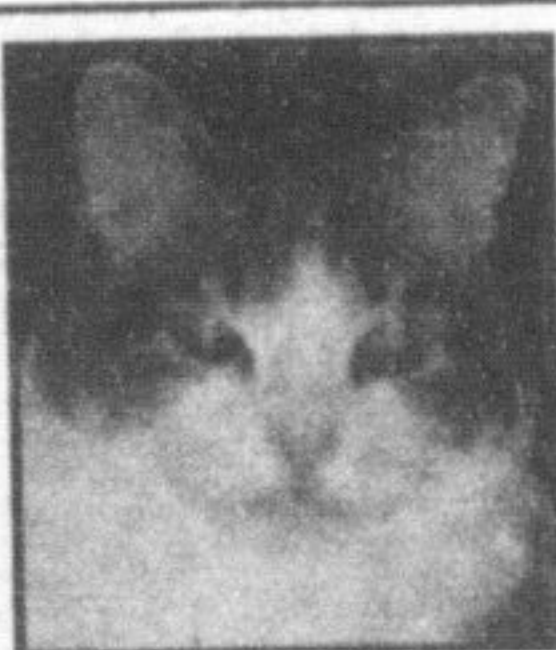
Dear Emily,
