Pot worth \$1.5 million seized

More than \$1.5 million worth of marijuana was seized by police following the raid of a rural Milton house Friday afternoon.

"It is the biggest one (seizure) this year in all of Halton," said Det. Anthony Odoardi of Halton Regional Police's Drug and Morality Bureau.

A total of 2,164 marijuana plants in various stages of growth were seized with a street value of \$1.5 million.

In addition, police seized 10 pounds of dry cannabis marijuana — with an estimated street value of \$20,000 — and a quantity of hydroponics equipment.

The raid took place at a house on Britannia Road West, just east of Regional Road 25, at 2 p.m. and was executed by Halton Regional Police's Drug and Morality Bureau, along with members of the Royal Canadian Mounted Police's Milton drug section.

Police allegedly located a sophisticated



cannabis marijuana lab in the basement of the house.

It's alleged a hydro-electric bypass was used to divert electricity to the lab before it was registered by the hydro-electric meter.

A 55-year-old man has been charged with production of a controlled substance, possession of a controlled substance for the purpose of trafficking and theft of electricity.

Injured climber rescued

It was a close call for a rock climber who plunged 20 feet down a cliff at Rattlesnake Point Conservation Area Sunday.

Police said the 29-year-old Toronto man was rappelling down the cliff face with friends at about 1:45 p.m. when his safety equipment failed and he fell, landing on his back on the rocks below.

It took more than an hour for rescue crews to bring the man back up, doing so with a special basket on ropes that can be pulled up. He was taken to Milton District Hospital, but suffered no serious injuries.

It was the fourth accident involving rock climbers at the park so far this year, said Ron Kindt, manager of Rattlesnake Point and Hilton Falls conservation areas.


