## Speeding OOWM. report

While speeding on Regional roads remains an issue, Halton Region reports there's been a significant reduction in excessive speeding on its road network.

The fact is contained in the 2007 State of the Regional Road System Report, which provides Halton-wide statistics on everything from speeding to road pavement quality.

In the speeding department, the report stated the majority of drivers travelling between 5 and 20 km over the posted speed limit decreased significantly from 68.3 per cent to 45.8 per cent from 2006 to 2007.

"This positive trend has been identified overall throughout Halton," said a staff report on the topic from Halton Commissioner of Legislative and Planning Services Mark Meneray.

The state of the roads report also showed many spots in Milton continue to make the top 20 list of high-speed locations in Halton, including:

- · Guelph Line, north of Steeles Avenue, between No. 20 Sideroad and No. 25 Sideroad, between Derry Road and Steeles Avenue and north of No. 15 Sideroad
- No. 32 Sideroad, west of Guelph Line
- No. 20 Sideroad, west of First Line and west of Guelph Line.

When it comes to traffic congestion, the report stated that it continues to be problematic in south Halton, particularly along the major east-west corridors, while areas of north Halton are experiencing moderate levels of congestion.

The document also indicates that 72 per cent of the Regional road network is considered to be in satisfactory or adequate condition.

The report will be forwarded to regional council today for information purposes.
