

Five charged with drunk driving in separate incidents

Police laid drunk driving-related charges in five separate incidents over just three days.

January 22 at 11 p.m., an SUV was reported in a ditch at Regional Road 25 and Derry Road. A 41-year-old Childs Drive man was charged with impaired driving and over 80.

Last Friday, police responded to a three-vehicle collision at Tremaine Road and Steeles Avenue at 6 p.m. A 74-year-old Tremaine Road man was charged with having care and control of a vehicle while impaired and over 80.

At 5 a.m. Saturday, a vehicle was observed weaving in and out of traffic in the area of Main and Ontario streets, and police were called.

A vehicle travelling westbound on Main Street was observed driving erratically by police and pulled over. A 39-year-old Scott Boulevard man was charged with impaired driving and over 80.

At midnight Sunday, a vehicle heading northbound on First Line, north of No. 20 Sideroad, drove into the ditch. Police responded and made an arrest. A 26-year-old

Graffiti discovered

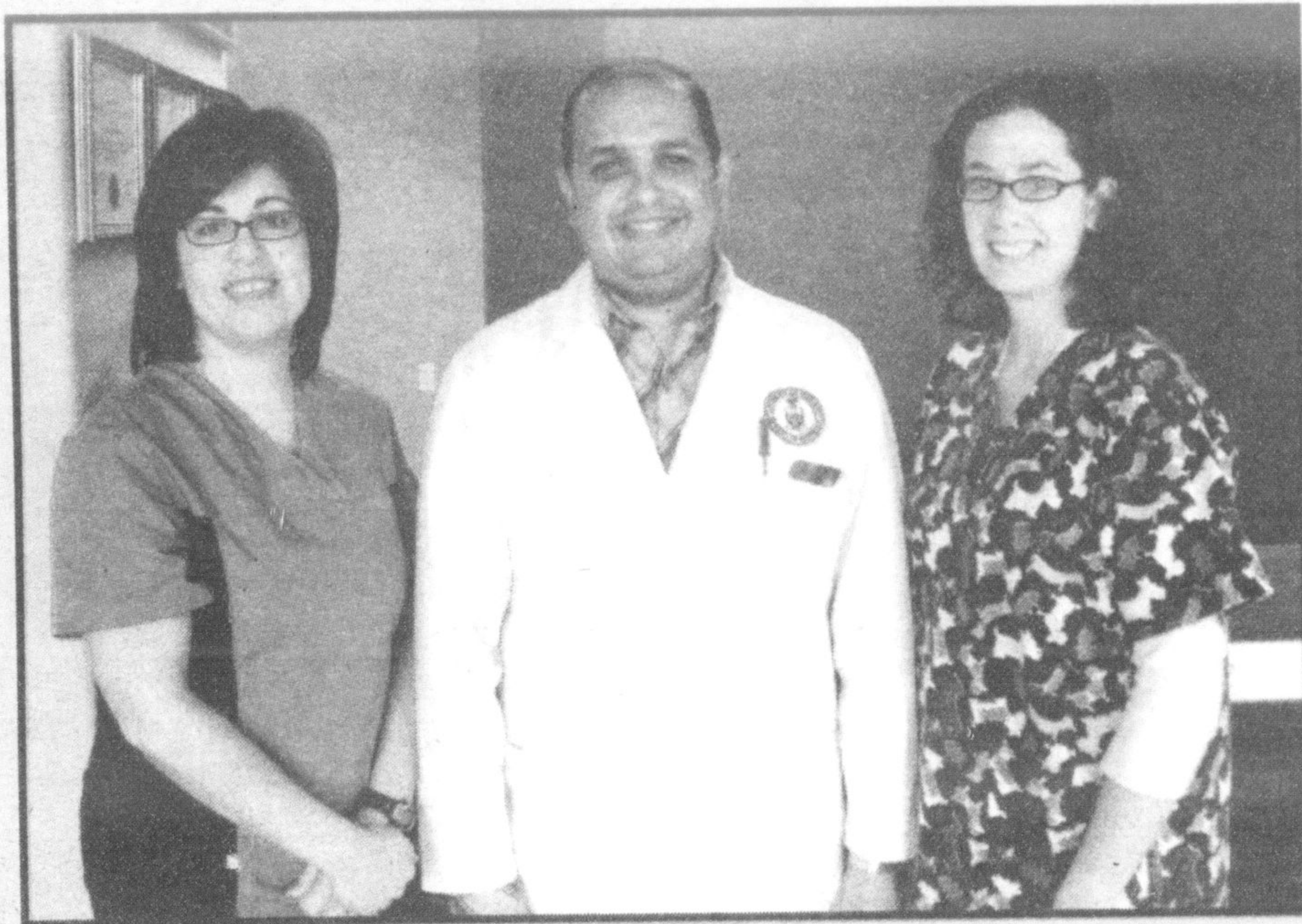
Racist graffiti was recently discovered at W.I. Dick school on Highside Drive.

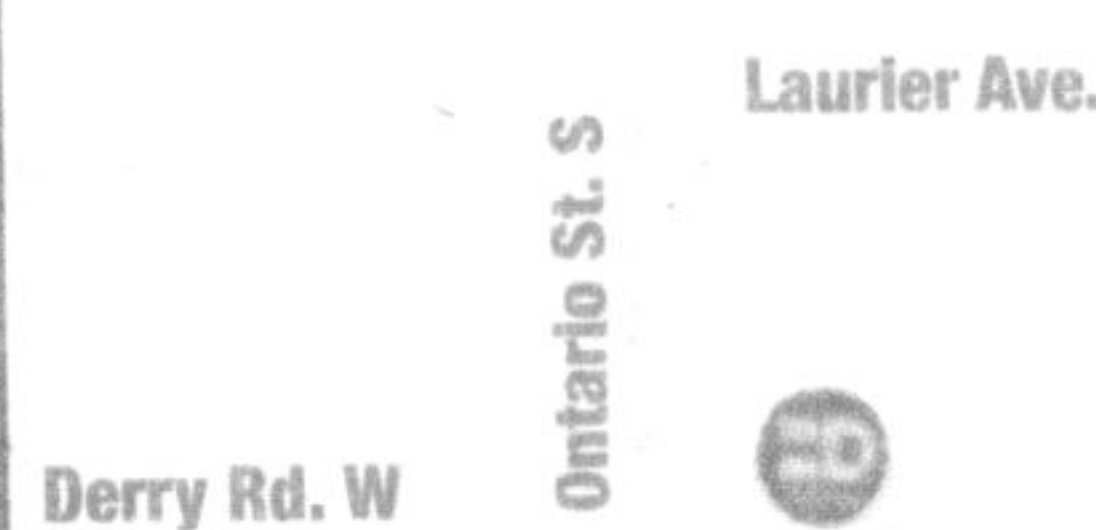

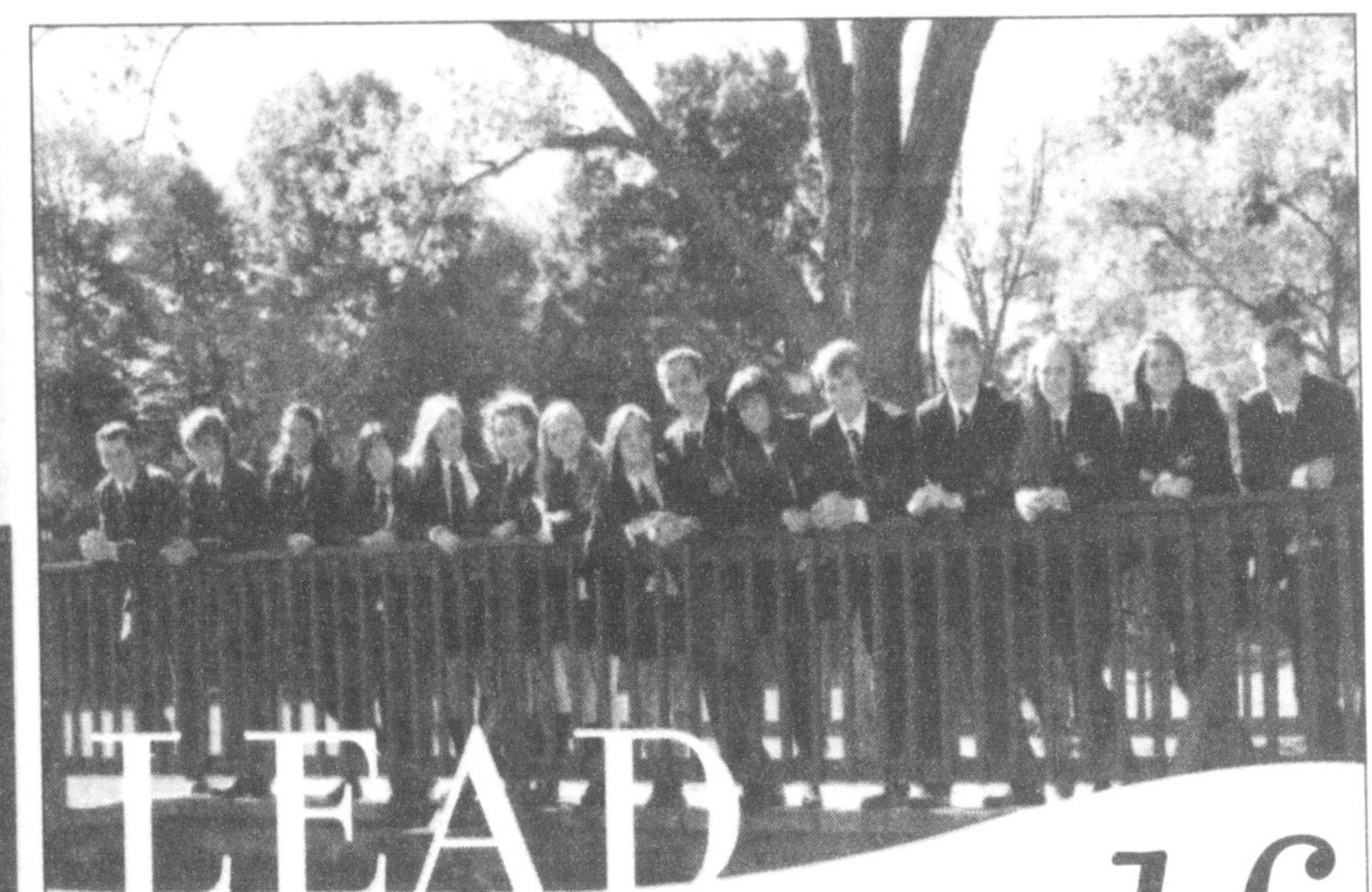
