**We all want our streets cleared of snow quickly,
but nothing slows down the work of snow plows
more than cars parked on the street. Don't forget:**


- The parking by-law in the Town of Milton is three hours unless otherwise posted.
- Cars must be removed from the road during snow clearing operations (in which case the three hour parking limit does not apply).
- Vehicles found to be impeding snow clearing operations can be ticketed and towed at the owner's expense.
- Keeping parked cars off the street will speed up snow removal and increase community safety.

Road Plowing Response Times

Snow plowing response times range depending on the severity of the snow/ice storm and the priority of roads (Regional roads are plowed first, then major Town thoroughfares and finally local streets).

Police cadet's gear stolen

An investigation is underway following the recent theft of police equipment from a cadet's personal vehicle in Milton.

Shortly after 6 p.m. February 12, a Peel Regional Police cadet parked his vehicle in the parking lot of Premier Fitness on Maple Avenue. Upon returning to the vehicle, he found a window had been smashed and several articles of police equipment had been stolen.

Missing are:

- Peel Regional Police uniform hat
- Peel Regional Police patrol jacket
- One pair of police pants
- Two notebooks
- Duty belt with baton, flashlight, handcuffs and key and radio holder
- Police duty bag containing Peel Regional Police sweater, rain jacket and traffic vest.

Halton Regional Police detectives continue to investigate the matter and remind the public to ask police officers to identify themselves with valid police ID if they have any doubts about an officer's identity.

The total value of the stolen property is \$1,650.
