A Milton commuter's online petition for GO Transit to retract both the fare hike it enacted this past weekend and one last year could set up an interesting political showdown in the Ontario legislature Monday.

Andrew Salmons, who quit taking the GO train to his work in Toronto last June due to poor performance and rising fares, started the petition last Friday after GO's board of directors passed its 2009-10 operating budget, which included a 25-cent fare hike for adult riders and a smaller one for seniors and children.

As of Thursday morning, the petition had received almost 1,700 signatures, many with angry comments regarding the Provinciallyfunded agency's decision to raise fares in a recession.
