Halton police are looking for the public's help in shattering the myth of self-invincibility that's prevalent among young people through the introduction of a safety program called SMARTRISK.

The program, which police hope to show to 22,000 high school students in Milton, Oakville and Burlington, is intended to demonstrate the consequences of risky behaviour.

"We're in the public safety business and we've been exposed to a program that we think has value," said Halton police Supt. Signy Pittman.

"This program works through positive messaging and there might be some key to that. They're not saying. 'Don't do this, don't do this.' They're saying when you do this, take these precautions (e.g. wear a helmet when riding an ATV)."


