## Council nixes day care

It appears the Town of Milton will have to go to the Ontario Municipal Board to defend council's decision Monday to reject rezoning of a home on Ontario Street to allow for a 20-child day care.

The applicant, Julia Zammit, owner of the existing five-child Home Away From Home day care at 350 Ontario St., said she plans to appeal the decision to the OMB.

"I'd met all the requirements they asked of me," explained Zammit, who said she was disappointed and confused by council's decision.

Milton's planning staff had recommended approval of the rezoning, noting the town has a dearth of more than 1,100 child care spaces.

However, only Ward 4 Councillor Wendy Schau and Ward 3 Councillor Cindy Lunau supported the development.

"This is not what the residents want in this neighbourhood," said Ward 3 Councillor Jan Mowbray, noting opposition from the nearby community. "I know we're short day care spaces. But that shouldn't be a reason to back us into a corner. This would be a rubber stamp to commercialization."

Lunau argued the side streets off of Ontario are still protected, and said children shouldn't be considered offensive to a neighbourhood.

Schau said the application was a site-specific amendment and wouldn't automatically allow for future commercialization.

"That will be what the OMB will base their decision on," she added. "I don't see how we'll have a leg to stand on."
