# Girl refuses to let purse be stolen

Police are looking for a couple who attempted to steal a purse from a 13-year-old girl March 28.

The girl was walking along the front of Symposium restaurant on Holly Avenue at about 3 p.m. When she stopped to use a phone, she was approached by a male and a female who were leaving the restaurant, police said.

A conversation ensued between the man and the girl. The man then grabbled the girl's purse, but she held on to it. The couple left for the parking lot.

The male suspect is described as white, about sixfoot-two, slightly tan with an average build and short brown hair. He was wearing a white baseball hat, a white polo shirt with blue stripes, blue jeans and running shoes.

The woman is described as white, with long, layered, straight brown hair with blond highlights. She was wearing a pink shirt and tan dress slacks.

Both suspects are in their late twenties.

Drunk driving charges laid

Police have arrested two men on suspicion of drunk driving.

On March 28, a citizen called police to report an erratic driver. A vehicle was located on Ontario Street and the driver was arrested. A 44-year-old Ontario Street North man has been charged with impaired driving and 'over 80.'

Wednesday at 9:12 a.m., police received a call regarding a vehicle in the ditch on Derry Road. Upon investigation, an arrest was made. A 44-year-old Mississauga man has been charged with impaired driving, 'over 80' and breach of an undertaking (he was already out on a form of release on another matter).

### Vehicle stolen and stripped

A stolen vehicle was recovered stripped of parts the following day in the garage of a house under construction.

Police said the vehicle — a black, 1995, two-door Honda Civic worth \$6,000 — was stolen from a driveway on Hepburn Road overnight March 26 and taken to an unfinished house on Scott Boulevard, where it was stripped.

It was found Saturday.

## Blaze suspicious

Yet another abandoned building has been involved in what's being considered a suspicious fire, this time to a barn on Ninth Line, north of Britannia Road.

Mississauga Fire and Emergency Services arrived first at the scene of the Wednesday night blaze at about 10:45 p.m. Crews from Milton Fire Department took over at 11:40 p.m. The barn contained mostly straw and the fire was contained to one corner, said fire prevention inspector Steve Ellis.

The local fire department remained on the scene until about 12:30 a.m. The value of the damage is minimal, Ellis said, and there were no injuries.

It's being considered suspicious because there's no electricity or activity in the barn, Ellis said, although firefighters couldn't determine how the blaze started.

This is at least the fourth fire to an abandoned building in Milton over the past three months.

Ellis said he doesn't think this most recent incident is connected to the others, mostly because in the other cases the structures were gutted.

"If someone wants it to go (be destroyed), usually by the time we get there, it's done," he said. "In the others, there was no chance of saving them."

# moving car

A senior citizen was left shaken Wednesday afternoon after a large tree fell onto his car, causing extensive damage.

"It hit the side of his car as he was driving by," said Steve Ellis of the Milton Fire Department. "If there had been a passenger, he would've been seriously hurt."

The dead tree fell at about 3:45 p.m. as the Huntsville motorist was driving westbound on No. 20 Sideroad, east of First Line. He was taken to Milton District Hospital with minor injuries.
