Teens to go hungry to raise funds to aid global food crisis

Hunger isn't fun for anyone, but for many people around the world it's more than a s growling stomach.

For some, it's a matter of life and death. Several groups of Milton youths are get-5 ting ready to step up to the plate to do their part in helping feed and provide the necessities of life to people in developing countries.

The national 30 Hour Famine — where students collect pledges and go without food for 30 hours — will take place tonight and

tomorrow, with a number of groups around town participating.

Last April, almost 500 Milton teens from schools, churches and youth organizations volunteered the 30 hours of their time and managed to raise almost \$10,000.

A few groups will do their "famine" later in the month; the event at E.C. Drury will take place overnight April 30.

This year's national goal is to raise \$5 million for projects in areas most devastated by the global food crisis. There will be 100,000 Canadian young people participating.

The economic downturn has most affected impoverished countries already suffering from higher fuel and food prices, conflict, poverty and HIV and AIDS, said a World Vision spokesperson.

"Preventing child hunger and malnutrition must be everyone's top priority in response to the global crisis," said Esther Park, event co-ordinator for World Vision.

"Canadian youth are doing their part in motivating their friends, families and communities to get involved in this initiative."

The 30 Hour Famine is Canada's longest running youth action campaign. It started in 1971 with a group of Calgary teens who held a fast, moved to action by TV images of a famine in Africa. The event now involves youth in 21 countries annually.
