- Certified compostable bags with the Biodegradable Products Institute (BPI) logo:




Bags that display the BPI logo are designed to compost quickly and safely when . composted in a commercial composting facility.


GreenCart materials in the following bags will not be collected:


- Plastic shopping bags

- Oxo-biodegradable bags



By excluding these plastic bags, we supply the composting facility with a clean material, resulting in a higher quality final compost product.
