

Home Décor Q&A:

Exterior Paint

Q: My vinyl siding has started to fade and is showing signs of weather damage. I can't afford to replace it, is it possible to paint it?

A: The good news is that it's possible to paint old and faded vinyl siding and you'll find it makes sense both economically and aesthetically. You can restore its original colour or opt for a different colour and give it a whole new look. You can also have the same benefits by painting aluminum siding. In both cases surface preparation and the use of top quality paint are crucial to achieve the look you desire.

Actually brand (www.sico.ca) recently launched a new high-quality top performing 100-per-cent acrylic latex exterior paint especially designed to beautify home exteriors and protect them from the elements.

Developed using a state-of-theart multi-sphere advanced technology; the exterior paint provides exceptional adherence and durability in both a flat or semi-gloss finish. Its high viscosity forms a protective coating that prevents water infiltration, resists mildew and UV rays, and fills in small surface defects so they virtually disappear. It can be applied in temperatures from as low as 1° C and as high as 32° C, and requires only one coat for maintenance jobs and two coats if repainting with a different colour.

For best results use a flat finish for vinyl or aluminum siding, concrete and stucco, and a semi-gloss finish for window frames, shutters and trim.
