

Smoking cessation contest on again

Butting out in March could be quite profitable.

That's courtesy of the provincial government's fifth annual Driven to Quit Challenge, which encourages Ontario adults who are daily smokers to break the habit.

Contest participants who stay smoke-free throughout the month are entered to win their choice of a new Honda hybrid, one of two \$5,000 CAA vacation getaways and one of seven \$2,000 MasterCard gift cards.

Each entrant registers with a support buddy, who can qualify to win a buddy prize of a \$200 MasterCard gift card.

"Our government is committed to helping Ontarians break the cycle of tobacco addiction. Every attempt to quit is a vital part of this process. That is why we support initiatives such as the Driven to Quit Challenge that encourage smokers to break the cycle of addiction to tobacco," said Margaret Best, Minister of Health Promotion and Sport.

The Halton Region Cessation Community of Practice (CoP) will serve as a partner for the challenge, which smokers can sign up for until Monday, Feb. 28. Early bird registrants qualify for a chance to win a \$1,000 MasterCard gift card.

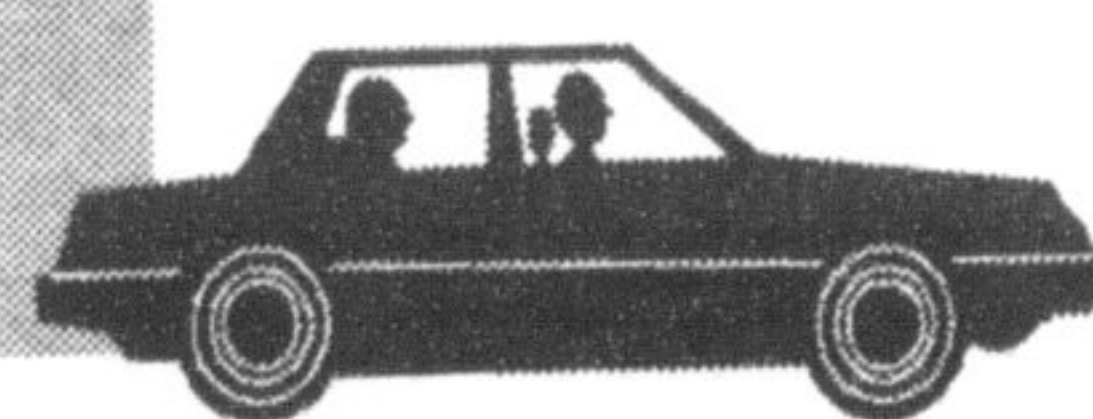

PROPOSED LOCAL OFFICIAL PLAN AMENDMENT

APPLICANT: THE CORPORATION OF THE TOWN OF MILTON

PROPOSAL

The purpose of this municipally-initiated local official plan amendment is to:

- Bring the Sherwood Survey Secondary Plan (Schedule C.8.D Sherwood Survey Land Use Plan) as adopted by Council July 2004 into conformity with the Town of Milton Official Plan. The existing Residential designation as shown on the subject lands will be changed to Residential/Office Area in order to reflect the designation as shown on Schedule B of the Town of Milton Official Plan (Consolidated August 2008).
- To introduce site-specific policies to allow for an increase in density on the site from a maximum of 100 units per net ha. to 120 units per net ha. provided the provision of specific Town objectives (i.e. provision of underground parking and the preservation and conservation of buildings or structures of historical, contextual or architectural merit).

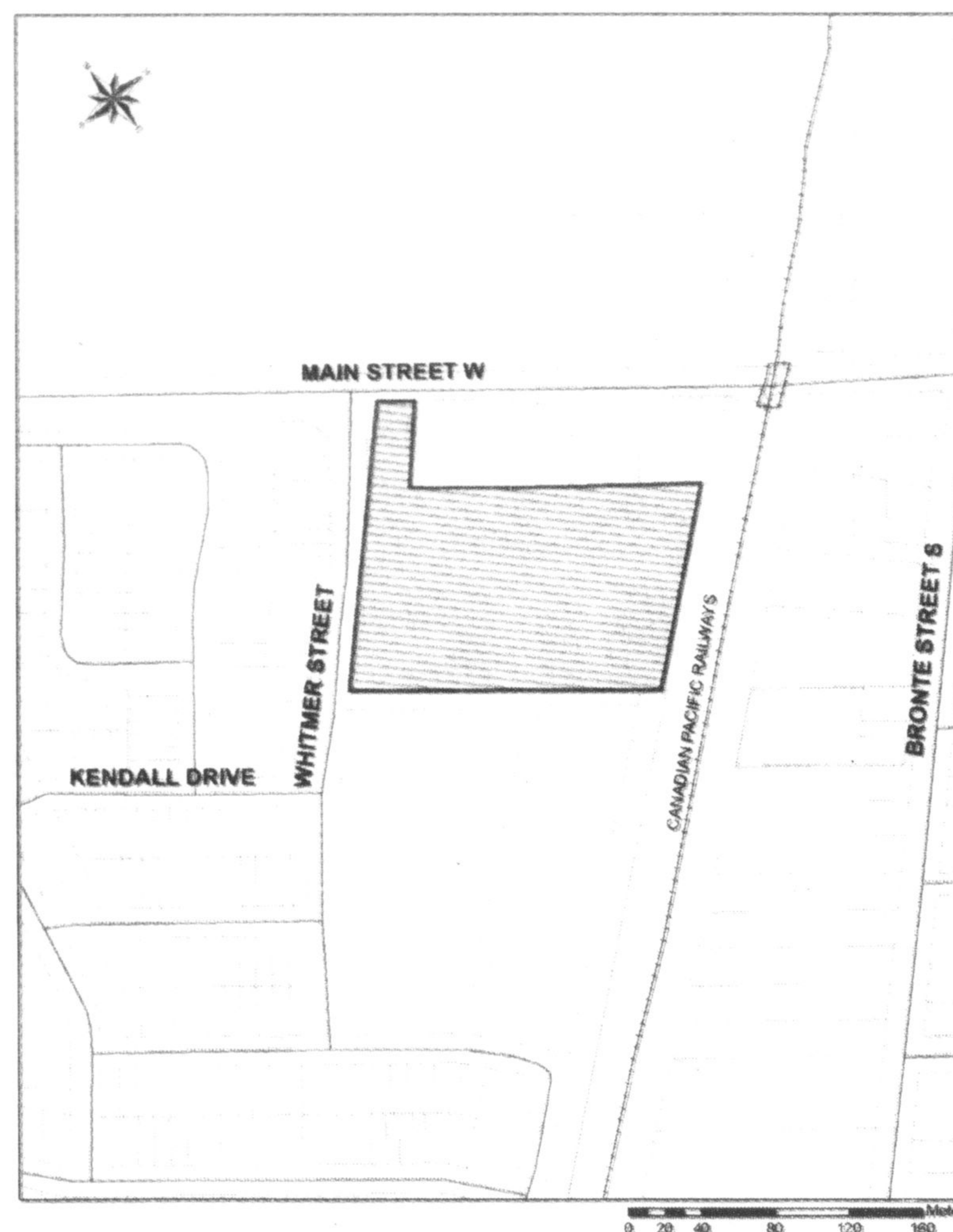
The Residential/Office Area designation is intended for lands within the Urban Area where higher density is to be encouraged and will permit a maximum density of 100 units per net hectare and a maximum height of seven storeys. This application is associated with a Zoning By-law Amendment Application (Town File: Z-12/10) made by David De Sylva for the subject lands to permit two six-storey condominium apartments. Each apartment is proposed to have 113 units for a total of 226 residential units.

If a person or public body that files an appeal of a decision of the Town of Milton to the Ontario Municipal Board does not make an oral submission at a public meeting or a written submission to the Town before a decision is made, the Ontario Municipal Board may dismiss all or part of the appeal. If you wish to be notified of Council's decision on this matter, you must submit a written request to the Town.
