Second suspect charged in child prostitution probe

Police have charged a suspect jointly with a Milton man who's currently before the courts on child prostitution-related charges.

The Halton Police Child Abuse and Sexual Assault (CASA) Bureau, in a co-ordinated effort with Peel Regional Police, charged 24-year-old

David Stone of Mississauga with numerous offences including gang sexual assault, aggravated sexual assault, human trafficking and unlawful confinement.

He's charged jointly with Aldain Beckford of Roper Drive, who was arrested in October and denied bail in Burlington's Ontario Court of Justice in December.

A publication ban has been imposed on details of his bail hearing.

At press time Friday, Stone was to appear in Milton court for a bail hearing.

'We need to predict and plan growth:'

Ontario's Minster of Infrastructure channeled the advice of hockey great Wayne Gretzky during last Tuesday's Breakfast with the Mayor event.

"Don't skate to where the puck is, skate to where it's going to be," Minister Bob Chiarelli told a sold-out audience of about 200, who gathered for the annual event hosted by Milton Mayor Gord Krantz and the Milton Chamber of Commerce.

"We need to predict and plan growth. Whether it's for our schools, community centres or hospitals, infrastructure needs to exist at every level of change and community growth."

The message was fitting considering Milton's burgeoning population, which will continue to grow for the next 20 years.

During his address, Chiarelli pointed at the Province's significant infrastructure stimulus funding following the global recession and its relation to the job market — mainly retaining 70,000 jobs in the province.
