Meeting for rural residents

Salt, in drinking water and on roads, are two topics to be addressed at a public information meeting next week hosted the Nassagaweya Community Consultation Committee (NCCC).

Wednesday's meeting, part of the Safe Living Series started by the NCCC in 2004 to keep rural residents informed on important local issues, will be held at the Nassagaweya Community Centre on Guelph Line in Brookville.

Jan Mowbray, one of the organizers of the event, said she's expecting a good turnout.

"We have had two of the public information meetings each year since 2004, with the exception of election years when only one is held, and the attendance has been very good. We usually get between 80 to 100 residents out to each meeting and I am expecting about the same for this one," she said.

Guest speakers for the evening will be Brad Jordon of the Halton Region Health Department (discussing 'What's In YOUR Water?') and Doug Thompson of the Town

of Milton (discussing winter road salt management.)

Mowbray said both issues have been of some concern to Nassagaweya residents.

"There have been some concerns expressed by locals regarding the high salt content in the drinking water as well as the amount of salt being used on the roads during the winter," said Mowbray. "These presentations will give residents some muchneeded information on these issues."

There will also be a mini trade show at the meeting as there has been in the past with many booths and displays set up in the hall.

"The NCCC is extremely pleased with the community support we have garnered with these sessions. Residents expressed a need to receive information on topics that pertain to those in the rural areas and that is the main objective of the Safe Living Series. We encourage everyone to come out," Mowbray

The doors will open at 6 p.m. with the presentations at 7:30 p.m.
