Family tops list of issues, says Rodrigues

The Canadian Champion has asked Halton riding's seven candidates three questions it feels are of the utmost importance. The responses from those who participated in the questionnaire are being published in Champion editions leading up to the October 6 provincial election. homelessness.



Do you know how many trillions of dollars there are in Halton because of limestone deposits? As for the university, I'm not happy with the site they chose.
