Winterhawks set for holiday tournament

Starts tomorrow at sports centre

Milton's holiday hockey bash will be under one roof this year.

With Milton Sports Centre's two new ice surfaces, John Tonelli Sports Centre won't be needed when the annual Winterhawks Classic (formerly the Beaver Tournament) kicks off tomorrow.

The three-day showcase will feature five divisions and a total of 25 teams this time around, with the tykes representing the biggest division — with seven entries.

The AA minor atoms and AA novices will have five teams each, with four teams battling it out for AA pee-wee and mite bragging rights.

The tykes and minor atoms look

poised to take a serious run at the gold, sporting records (at press time) of 14-1-2 and 15-5-4 respectively.

Back by popular demand will be the tournament's skills competition, which includes every single player as opposed to just a select few representatives from each team like many other events.

This all-inclusive skills showcase has been a key drawing card in recent years, as the Milton Minor Hockey Association struggles to maintain its participation numbers through the busiest time of the season for tournaments.

The tournament will include a total of 49 games, with the division championships slated for Thursday afternoon — all in MSC's new 400-seat feature rink.

Lynne Fuller returns as chair of the Winterhawks Classic, which is still in need of volunteers.

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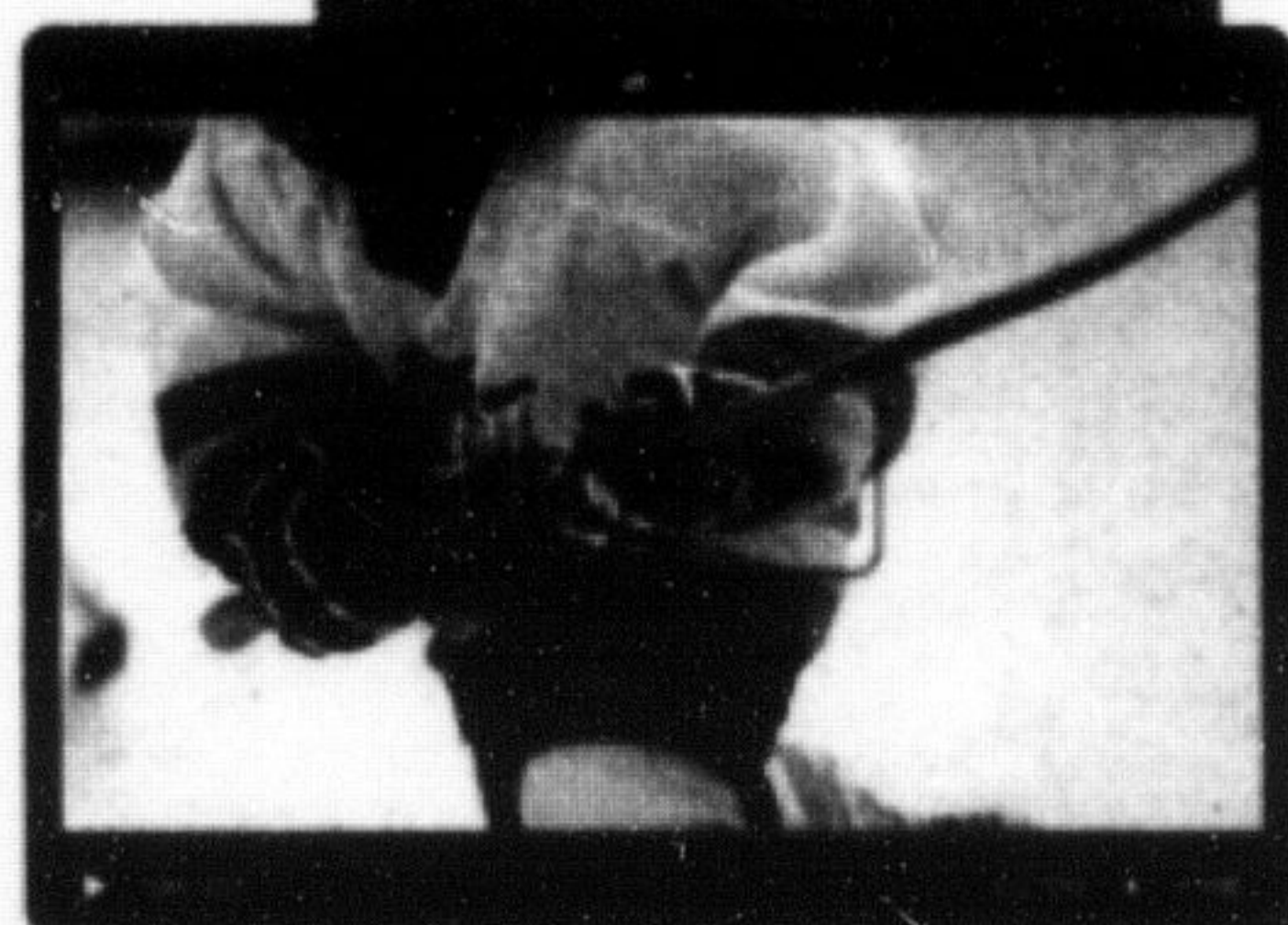

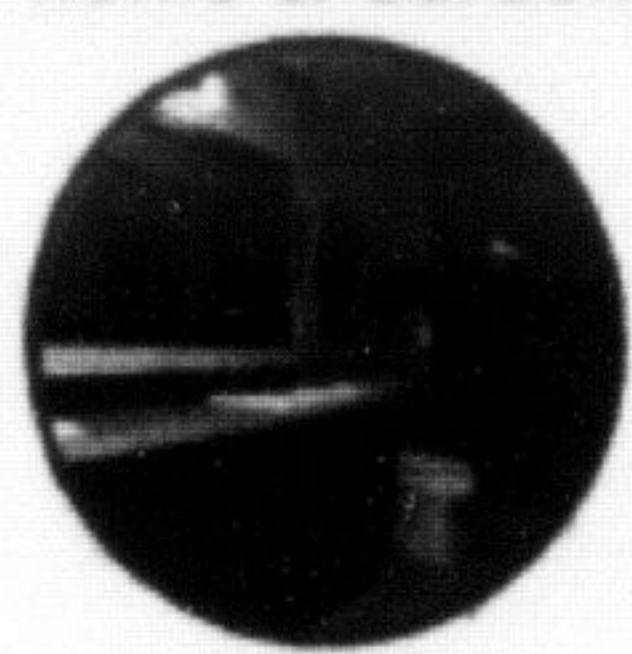

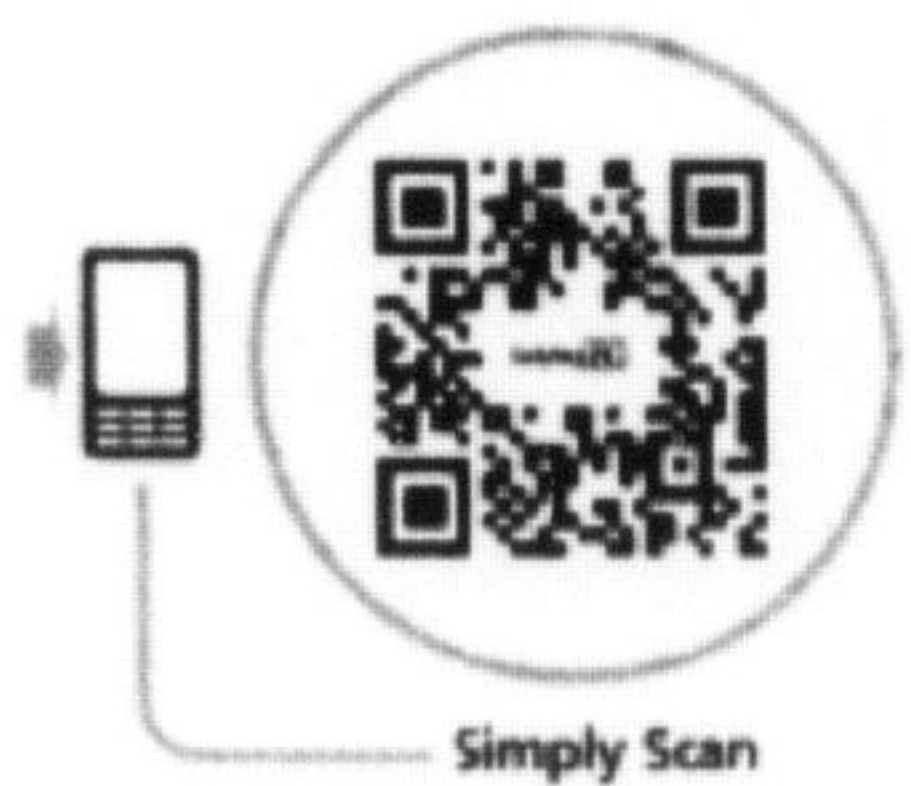
