Sentencing expected Sept. 14

Alchin looked straight ahead, sitting with his lawyer.

After court was adjourned, there were hugs and smiles.

"Justice has been served," said Stuart Cooper, Lauren's father.

Lauren's best friend, Miranda Fragomeni, was thrilled.

"Even if he gets a year (in jail), it doesn't matter. The fact is he's guilty and he'll have that in his head."

She said the verdict offers a sort of closure.

Defence lawyer Paul Stunt said he was surprised and disappointed with the judge's decision; Alchin has never wavered in his stance that he's not guilty and repeatedly refused to take a plea bargain.

"He was devastated by this accident and this (verdict) continues it," Stunt said, adding, "I'll do all I can to see if we can avoid an incarceration."

Fragomeni stated Alchin either knew he'd hit someone or suspected it and chose to remain ignorant.

"Mr. Alchin suspected the truth, knew that he should have inquired further and deliberately refrained from doing so," he wrote.

Although it's unlikely Alchin could have avoided the crash, he saw Lauren and knew it wasn't a deer he'd hit, Fragomeni said.

"I am satisfied... that Mr. Alchin saw a person... I reject his evidence that he did not see anything."

Crown attorney Craig Fraser said he's glad the case is ending for the Coopers' sake. "I think for them there's some comfort in the verdict."

He said he'll be seeking a "significant" sentence with jail time.

Sentencing submissions will be heard September 14.
