The Sox began their roll as Adam Scheerer pitched a two-hit shutout in a 2-0 victory over East York. Scheerer struck out eight and allowed only two walks. Lauzon delivered the key hit, a two-run single in the third inning.

Milton got another strong pitching performance in their first game on Sunday as Adam Ahearn threw a

> four-hitter, fanning seven in a 1-0 win over Lakeside. Jon Roth went 2-for-3 and drove in the game's only run.

The Sox followed that up by

rallying for a 5-4 win over Oakville. Milton erased a 3-0 deficit with a three-run fifth inning and took the lead with two more in the top of the seventh. Roth and Joe Jurus each delivered RBI-doubles. Dave Strutt had a run-scoring single and Mills contributed a pair of hits.




