## Man ordered to stand trial in alleged road rage incident

A Milton man was committed Wednesday to stand trial for an alleged road rage incident in which a driver was killed on Hwy. 401.

Wayne Winsor, 40, will stand trial on charges of criminal negligence causing death, dangerous remain at the scene of an accident causing death. He could face life in prison if convicted.

Tony Greco, 55, died in the early-morning collision last July. He was a married father of three children.

Winsor was arrested after he turned himself in to the OPP about 12 hours later.

Winsor remains out on bail. His release conditions included being prohibited from driving or even sitting behind the wheel of a vehicle.

The vehicles entered the east-

bound ramp and accelerated, police said. Moments later, the driver of one is alleged to have slammed on his brakes directly in front of the other.

The driver of the second car swerved to avoid a crash but lost control, police said. The car — an SUV — rolled over several times after striking a concrete barrier.

Police said the driver wasn't wearing seat belts and was ejected onto the highway.
