staff set a price tag of \$1.3 million for the repairs, but revised it to \$2.4 million in May after reassessing the costs.

It now stands at about \$3 million as the Town included pedestrian linkages to Bronte Meadows Park and Milton District High School along with landscaping in its final application.

Milton staff haven't yet submitted a report

to town council on how the municipality intends to fund its one third share of the costs for the two projects, which will be part of the 2010 and 2011 capital budgets.
