

## NOTICE OF STUDY COMMENCEMENT

#### THE STUDY

The Ministry of Transportation Ontario (MTO) has retained McCormick Rankin Corporation (MRC) to conduct a Preliminary Design and Class Environmental Assessment (Class EA) Study to identify capacity, geometric and operational improvements along the Highway 401 corridor from 1.0 km west of Hespeler Road easterly to the west Halton Region boundary, within the Region of Waterloo and the County of Wellington, as shown in the Key Plan. The study will identify operational and capacity needs, evaluate alternatives and recommend a plan to address the short, medium and long-term needs of the Highway 401 corridor, including the addition of new lanes, rehabilitation/replacement of structures and interchange improvements. A section of the approved Environmental Assessment for Highway 6, Freelton to Guelph, falls within the limits of this study.



#### THE PROCESS

The study will follow the Class Environmental Assessment (EA) for Provincial Transportation Facilities (2000) process for a Group 'B' project.

External agency and public consultation will take place throughout the study, including two rounds of Public Information Centres (PICs). The PICs will provide the public and interest groups an opportunity to discuss the study with members of the project team. Notices providing the time and location of the PICs will be posted on the project website (www.highway401-hespeler-halton.ca), published in local newspapers and sent to persons on the project mailing list.

Upon completion of the study, a Transportation Environmental Study Report (TESR) will be prepared and made available for public review. Notices will be posted and published at that time to explain the review process and identify the locations where the TESR is available for the 30-day public review period.
