Hamilton AAA squad that reigned supreme at last spring's provincial championships.

"Obviously having the top two players from the best midget team in Ontario is an important piece of the puzzle for us," said Piett, whose team wrapped up its exhibition stand with a 1-2 showing at this past weekend's Woodchuck Classic in Vermont.

Milton's owner also expects big things from winger Trevor Hunt, an eighth-round pick of the London Knights in 2008 who led last year's Mississauga Senators.

The trio join a forward unit led by third-

year veteran Curtis Renaud, who developed into the IceHawks' best all-around performer last season, collecting 31 goals and 31 assists along with providing a fair amount of grit to a lineup in short supply of that.

Noted Piett, "Basically we don't need Curtis to do anything differently than he did last year. He's definitely a top player."

Also back from the forward ranks are Ryan Stroz, Justin Periera and Skylar Ell.

While the blueline remains a work in progress, the IceHawks have acquired 19-year-old Scott Fasano from Villanova and 18-year-old Mike Miller — who spent last sea-

son with Brockville of the Central Jr. A League and is off to Bowling Green next fall — to help stabilize things.

Goaltending is another question mark right now, but from a more positive standpoint, as 18-year-old OHL prospect Craig Rylett is now back from the Sudbury Wolves — joining 2008/09 call-up Brian Betts and Montreal's Jake Williams, who backstopped Jr. B Elmira last year.

Piett offered no indication just who should emerge as the number one man between the pipes, stating only that Milton will likely carry three netminders for the time being and that all three are capable of becoming the starter.

Just eight of the Ontario Jr. A League's 15 teams will now see post-season play, making a playoff berth a rather lofty goal for young developing clubs like the IceHawks.

But Piett feels the stricter cut-off mark will be to both the fans' and league's benefit.

"It's going to put more teams in a dogfight for a playoff spot and make every game intense throughout the season," he said. "The NCAA coaches and scouts are certainly in favour of the change."

With Memorial Arena still undergoing major renovations, the IceHawks' home opener won't be until Sunday, Sept. 27, when they take on Oakville at 3:30 p.m.

Big finish for Under-14 Magic boys

Rebounding from their only loss in a month, the Under-14 Magic boys punctuated their regular season with a 1-0 victory over Brantford City Monday night at Lions Sports Park.

Cesar Galarreta earned his fourth shutout in the last five games, while Armaan Neemunchwala was the lone marksman, burying a low shot from about 20 feet out early in the first half. From there the short-staffed Magic maintained the lead with a rock-solid defensive effort — highlighted by Adam Lauder, who neutralized the visitors' top offensive threat — and some exceptional play from midfielder Ricky Vieira.

Stepping things up after a challenging start to the season, with seven new players joining the mix, Milton finished at 6-7-3.

The Under-14 boys close out 2009 this weekend at the Richmond Hill Tournament.
