An advertisement, whether it's in a phone book or a billboard, simply won't give you the kind of information you need in order to make a sensible decision about who should move you. You've got to do

your new location while you're getting settled. A good mover will normally have working relationships established with a variety of companies offering these and other services that are so important in those


