The fourth annual event once again offered elementary school students across the region unique insight into the world's most precious resource — water — through a variety of demonstrations and activities.

Spectacular fall views at area parks

The arrival of fall brings with it countless opportunities to enjoy nature.

Conservation Halton's (CH) six main parks are offering residents one more opportunity to do just that with its Fall into Nature festival, which starts this weekend and celebrates the spectacular landscapes and colours of the Niagara Escarpment.

Visitors are invited to stop by Milton's Mountsberg, Crawford Lake, Kelso and Rattlesnake Point conservation areas as well as the nearby Hilton Falls and Mount Nemo parks for the event, which will take place tomorrow, Sunday and Thanksgiving Monday as well as October 17 and 18.

Park visitors purchasing a one-day park entry during the festival will receive a Fall into Nature passport valid for one full day's admission to all six parks.

Show your passport on subsequent days and save on admission. Collect stamps at each park to enter for a chance to win prizes.

A free shuttle service will run between the parks (except Mount Nemo) each day, with

shuttle riders encouraged to leave their vehicles in one of the primary parking areas at Kelso or Mountsberg.

A variety of activities for all ages will take place, including hiking, canoeing, geocaching, live music, barbecues and camping. Some additional fees apply.

There will be self-guided and interpreterled tours through CH's many trails and landscapes at every park, including the picturesque trek from Rattlesnake Point to Crawford Lake. At Kelso, visitors will be able to take chairlift rides to the top of the escarpment for spectacular views.

Crawford Lake and Mountsberg will feature wagon rides through the parks.

And of course, visitors will also be able to take in the regular activities and programs at the parks, including the birds of prey demonstrations at Mountsberg and the Iroquoian village at Crawford Lake.


