Once they were fierce rivals on the racetrack; now an area automotive technician and a respected stock car racer are gearing up to raise money for a worthy cause.

This Saturday at 11 a.m., mechanic Glenn Colling and Gary Elliott, who races at Flamboro Speedway, will be part of an event called Toonies for Tools in efforts to raise money to send a 'Repair Shop in a Box' to a country in west Africa.

At about 11 a.m., just before the noon start of the Downtown Milton Street Festival, residents can get an up-close-and-personal look at Elliott's 2010 Monte Carlo stock car in front of Knox Presbyterian Church, 170 Main St. E.

Shortly after that, there'll be a chance to hear Elliott and Colling speak from their hearts about the cause.

Having Elliott lend his support for the event has been a bit of a walk down memory lane for Colling, who himself raced for about 10 years against Elliott, the longest running stock car racer in Ontario.

"Sometimes we were fierce competitors, but most of the time we got along really well," Colling said.

The idea for an Auto Repair Shop in a Box stems from a two-week trip Colling took with organization Careforce International to

"I always wanted an experience like that — to mix up life a bit," Colling said.

Colling went to help build an additional dormitory for students who are bused in from surrounding communities to attend a free school — the vision of a pastor and assisted by Careforce.

But it wasn't long before his automotive skills were discovered and he was put to work fixing everything from diesel engines to tractors. Nobody local had the expertise to fix the equipment themselves.

"I kind of amazed myself with a lot of the things I was able to do," Colling said.

While there, Colling imagined how useful


