

Long-serving, retiring teachers to be honoured

Special ceremony tomorrow in Oakville

More than 1,300 years of service to the Halton Catholic District School Board will be recognized as retiring and 25-year anniversary employees are honoured at a special ceremony.

The 24th annual Board Staff Recognition Night is set for tomorrow at the Oakville Conference and Banquet Centre.

The Eucharistic celebration will be officiated by Anthony Tonnos, Bishop of Hamilton, along with the Rev. Raymond Modeski, pastor of St. Patrick Church in Burlington.

The night also will include a reception and dinner for the honourees. The Bishop Reding Secondary School Jazz Band will entertain.

The Halton Catholic board will recognize 24 staff members who have served the board for 25 years and 35 who are retiring this year. Collectively, the 59 staffers have contributed more than 1,320 years of service.

"It is the strong commitment and dedication of each of our employees in their respective roles that enables our system to continue to deliver the highest quality and experience of Catholic education to the communi-

ties we serve," said Director of Education Michael Pautler.

This year, the honour of the longest-serving retiring staff member is shared by three educators, each of whom is retiring with 34 years of service: Brian Morris, vice-principal of St. Bernadette School in Oakville; Rosemary Oliver, a teacher at Canadian Martyrs School in Burlington; and Lydia Ribble, a teacher at St. Timothy School in Burlington.
