Anderson and Devonshire reclaim provincial fours gold with McKerihen-skipped team; 6th win in past 8 years

Back together — and back on top.

Reuniting for this season's provincial fours championship run, Steve McKerihen's Etobicoke-based lawn bowling team which includes Miltonians David Anderson (vice) and John Devonshire (second) reigned supreme for the sixth time in eight years earlier this month in Burlington.

Sparked by a hard-fought opening-round win over a team from Hanover - scoring three points in the last two ends to win 16-10 - the perennial champs went unbeaten in six matches to reclaim the gold.

This cemented this year's run in decisive fashion, disposing of a Kitchener team 18-4.

"We grabbed an early lead and every time they had an opportunity, we took it away," said Anderson, whose contingent also includes lead Fred Wallbank, who along with Devonshire will be competing in triples at the Commonwealth Games in Delhi, India this October. "Basically everything was going right for us."

That was pretty much the case throughout the weekend, with McKerihen winning convincingly at every turn.


Said Anderson, "I know it's a cliché, but it really was teamwork that won it for us. If one guy was having an off game,
